

Shrike The World's First Anti-Radiation Missile By: Charlie May Thursday, 26 March 2020 7:00 PM Marriott Spring Hill Suites

Admission is Free – Donations are Highly Suggested

Shrike was the world's first anti-radiation missile. It was designed to detect, track, and damage enemy ground-based radars being used to direct surface-to-air missiles (SAMs) at incoming aircraft. Shrike was conceived, designed, developed, and tested at China Lake. A little-known fact is that Shrike played an important role in the Cuban Missile crisis. Shrike seekers were mounted on an A-4 aircraft and flown towards the Russian ballistic missile sites in Cuba. This caused the ground radars of the surface-to-air missiles protecting the ballistic missiles to "light up." This allowed the Shrike seeker to determine the type of SAMs protecting the ballistic missile site, providing important tactical information.
