

What could be more important????

The Board of Directors of the China Lake Museum Foundation voted at its August meeting to locate the planned, new building for the Naval Museum of Armament and Technology on a 9-acre plot immediately south of the Naval Air Weapons Station's Main Gate. (See aerial photo, below.)

The structure that houses the Navy's twelfth official museum will be on Navy property, but accessible through the Ridgecrest Business Park. This will make the NMAT highly visible to visitors, while easing the burden on NAWS resources to provide security, fire protection and utilities. This site selection resulted from studies by the CLMF New Facilities Working Group (Steve Benson, Dan Goss, Ray Miller and John Robbins) and able assistance and cooperation from Captain Seaman and Captain Hollinberger of NAWS, as well as key representatives of the City of Ridgecrest.

The challenge now is to raise sufficient funding to initiate construction of the new building. The tentative plan is to build in two phases, with each phase providing approximately 20,000 square feet. This should ultimately yield about 34,000 square feet of exhibit space, with the remainder for gift shop, offices, auditoriums, etc

SIDEWINDER 50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION BOB CAMPBELL, NAWCWD Museum Director

The year 2002 marks the 50th anniversary of the invention at China Lake of Sidewinder, the world's most accurate, reliable, and successful missile--a missile adopted and copied by friend and foe alike. VADM Joseph W. Dyer, Commander, Naval Air Systems Command, has announced that the NAVAIR Team at China Lake will host a celebration of this milestone 31 October through 2 November 2002. Mark your calendars!

Under the leadership of Scott O'Neil and Captain D. J. Venlet, a Steering/Action Committee is hard at work planning the event, which will be patterned after the very successful China Lake 50th Anniversary Celebration in 1993. The Committee has defined the goals of the Sidewinder Celebration as: (1) to provide a museum-quality "Sidewinder Story" exhibit illustrating the origin, development and accomplishments of Sidewinder here at China Lake and nationally; (2) to host a gala reunion for renewal of old acquaintances with former fellow employees; (3) communicate the future prospects of Sidewinder and other RDT&E programs now under way at China Lake.

On September 19 several members of an Advisory Board (consisting of legacy Sidewinder and management personnel) met at the Museum to provide inputs for this celebration. Frank Knemeyer, former NWC Deputy Technical Director for Strike Systems, chairs this Board.

Current plans have the festivities kicking off on Thursday night with a Wuzwinder Party, echoing the exuberant celebrations prompted by successful test firings throughout the decades. The following day there will be a City Reception honoring the Sidewinder Team, along with a golf tourney and the premiere display of some of the Celebration's special exhibits. On Saturday there will be an open house in Michelson Laboratory. Also, numerous outside exhibits will be displayed, and videos will be screened throughout the day at the Museum and Mich Lab. Plans are being developed for a flight demonstration, including the possible firing of a Sidewinder. A gala dinner dance will take place on Saturday night, and the festivities will wind up with a picnic on Sunday.

The China Lake Museum Foundation is heavily involved with the base in the planning for this event. Our efforts are focused on pulling together the Sidewinder Story exhibit for the Museum, and in addition we are working to identify and invite speakers for the different events. We will interface with the Steering/Action Committee to host special speakers throughout the year, in order to further document some of the Sidewinder Story for historical purposes.

As well, we are initiating efforts to find corporate financing to commission Larry Zabel to create a commemorative painting in honor of this occasion, which will be donated to the Foundation. We are also seeking sponsoring organizations/corporations to provide funds to build the Sidewinder Story exhibit. If any of you have or know of any special Sidewinder artifacts or experiences which should be shared at this event, please contact us at the Museum and we will follow up.



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

With the standing-up of the Museum, the Foundation's Board of Directors reorganized, establishing five Vice President groups to do business and planning of activities for the Foundation.
